## Welcome to The Women's College of the University of Denver at the Chambers Center for the Advancement of Women!

### Student and Community Engagement

Staff members are available to support student and faculty needs in the Student and Community Engagement suite, Room 111, and the Pioneer Resource Center, Room 190. The second floor workroom has student group mailboxes, staplers and other office equipment, as well as a refrigerator, microwave, and sink for community use. In addition, this resource room has a self-serve coffee maker for weeknight and interterm use.

### Advising and Registration

Advising and registration services are offered on class weekends and during the week. Located in the Student and Community Suite, Room 111, The Women's College advisers provide a diverse range of services tailored to meet the needs of new, continuing, and graduating students including academic planning and advising; registration, financial aid, and scholarship support; resource information and referrals; and graduate school advising and planning.

### Pioneer Resource Center

The Pioneer Resource Center is a computer lab and electronic resource center for The Women's College community, funded and endowed by the late Helen McLoraine and the Pioneer Fund. This room is open during our college access hours for drop in access to computers, laptop power and data stations, scanner, photocopier, network printing using a Pioneer Card flex account, and comfortable study areas. The code for the keypad is 1901\*.

### Educational Resource Centers & Tutoring Services

The Educational Resource Centers and Tutoring Services at The Women's College are available to provide students with general support in Communication, Computing, Mathematics, Finance, Accounting, and the Natural Sciences. Depending on the structure of the Center or tutoring service, students may make individual appointments or drop-in with questions about class topics or professional challenges. These centers are open to all students of The Women's College at no additional cost. Please refer to the Educational Resource Centers and Tutoring Services flyer for a detailed schedule.

### Community Meals and Coffee

Our Saturday and Sunday community meals are held 12:00-1:30 pm in the Centennial Halls Food Court. Vending machines are in the second floor resource room of the Chambers Center for sodas, juices, water, coffee drinks, and snacks. Full-service coffee is available in the Garden Room on class weekends Friday, Saturday and Sunday's. Self-service coffee is available during the evenings and interterms. All accoutrements will also be located in the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor resource room. We ask our community members to use coasters and drink containers with lids and to let staff members know if a spill occurs.

### TWC Student Community Group

Being a member of the TWC Student Community group grants you access to: the student community calendar, room bookings, student group activities, and communication between groups, announcements and updates from your colleagues and the college, plus more. ### Technology in the Chambers Center

All classrooms have LCD projectors with VCR, DVD, and laptop feeds. All can provide data and power connections to each seat, many in a flexible format, and the building has wireless access throughout. ### Building Access

#### Class Weekends

Monday-Sunday, the building doors are unlocked 7am- 7pm. Students, faculty, and staff can access SE doors with card swipe from 7-10pm.

#### Non- Class Weekends/Interterms

Monday-Friday, the building doors are unlocked 7am- 7pm. Students, faculty, and staff can access SE doors with card swipe from 7-10pm. Saturday and Sunday the building can be accessed via the SE door card swipe 7am-10pm.

The Chambers Center will be closed in observance of all university holidays.

### **Merten Lending Library**

This is a free resource lending library that is dependent on book donations from students at The Women's College. It operates on an honor system and is open to all students of The Women's College. The library is located in the Pioneer Resource Center. Stop by and check out the selection of books or donate your books from previous quarters.

2007-2008 Parking permits are available to purchase through the online webPark system on the Parking Services website. Specific information about the permit process, sales, important changes, and restricted lot availability can be found on the Parking Services website. The annual parking permits are valid September 1, 2007 until August 31, 2008. Students can purchase a general night/weekend permit for only a quarter or for the entire year. Permit prices are prorated on a monthly basis.

**Many students choose to purchase a general night/weekend permit, which is valid after 4pm during the week and on the weekends. Lot Q, the 45 spaces adjacent to the Chambers Center, is a general night/weekend lot after 4pm.** Parking will be available on a first come, first serve basis, with this lot being reserved for The Women's College community weekday evenings and on class weekends during large campus events. Lot K (corner of Evans and Race) and Lot 103 (corner of High and Buchtel) are the other closest general night/weekend lots. During class weekends, the arm for Lot Q will be down to assure sufficient parking is available for our students. Lot Q can be accessed by entering the code 8881\* into the keypad as you pull into the lot. It is still necessary for all students parking in Lot Q to have an appropriate pass to park in the lot.

The lottery for restricted permits occurs in June of each year. Visit the Parking Services website to get up-to-date information on restricted lot availability. Lots L and T are restricted.
